• **Mediation Style:**

It has been a usual practice of arb-med-arb in Chinese arbitration. In some arbitration cases, I, mostly with the co-arbitrators, help the parties reach a settlement agreement, and then issued the decisions according to the institutional rules (particularly CIETAC and BAC). In those cases, the mediation style is mainly facilitative while sometimes evaluative competencies were applied

at different stages. I am able to shift from one style to another according to the actual needs of the specific situation. For instance, if the most important tasks are to overcome communication blockages, identify obstacles, and develop options for mutual benefits, and enable an agreement to be reached by parties, I often served as a facilitative mediator. If the parties maintain that there is a need to break deadlocks by giving non-binding opinions, making comments about the facts and the law of the case, guiding the parties in more directive ways, I may also employ evaluative style. I have seldom, if not never, used transformative mediation style thus far.
